Dandelions Everywhere

We have been studying dandelions and I learned something I never knew. You might be interested to know that about 8-10 days after a dandelion blooms it begins to withdraw its yellow flower back into itself. Much like a caterpillar makes a cocoon. While inside it turns into a white fluffy ball. It then spouts out of the top with a ball of fluff which has a seed on the end.

The wind or a person blows on it and all the seeds scatter. They resend on the ground and bloom again.
