What we are working on:

This month in our classroom

Each morning we say the Pledge of Allegiance and Our Father prayer. And at snack and lunch we say grace. The children have made so much progress with reciting these! We are working on the hand placement for "In the name of the Father". We encourage you to practice at home with them

We have just finished the letter C, and are beginning D and working our way thru November with E and F.

We are working on a whole year project that will be a big surprise to parents when we finish. We are also learning sign language with the letters.

We will also be learning the numbers 4,5 and 6 this month. We get a lot of practice counting but need to concentrate on number recognition too.

We finished up our 5 senses this week and will start to talk about "caring and sharing" and managing emotions.

For religion we are going to be discussing how we can **care**, **share**, **and be helpful**.

In November, we will be changing the centers. We are still working on having the children stay engaged in the centers they choose. I have seen great progress so far, and we will continue to encourage them...even with the anticipated excitement about the new items in the centers.

We had a visit by the fire department last month. The children were very excited and enjoyed learning about Fire safety from the firemen and of course sitting in the fire truck!
