


Preschoolers especially enjoy his colorful illustrations, creative language, and the fun lessons woven into his stories about kindness, creativity, and believing in themselves



## St Patrick's Day!



We will be celebrating St. Patrick's Day at school on **MONDAY, March 16th!**

We will create a fun rainbow craft and search for some gold coins.






## Diane Alber
