## We will start our unit of Nocturnal Animals.

We are focusing these activities as a multi step process and following directions. The tasks that the children will be attempting is tracing, cutting and gluing to create many of these projects. This will help teach the children the importance in following direction.

The children will color an owl and branch that will hold the letters in their name for our name game wall.

The children will create a forest scene at night.

The children will create a moon by completing a fun science experiment to color in our moon.

The children will paint with a fork to create the spiny spikes on a hedgehog

They will paint, on an easel, a green bullfrog then we will complete the project by cutting out their frog.

The last project in this lesson; they will have a choice of 2 or 3 out of 4 animals to make. The 4 options for them to choose from are Opossum, Raccoon, Skunk or Fox. Each of these projects involve different fine motor skills including tracing, cutting, gluing and, most importantly, following directions.

After Nocturnal animals we will focus on being thankful.

The children will create a turkey using a coffee filter and markers and then spray with water to see them transform into feathers.

The children will water color a cross and add some things that they are thankful for on the cross.
