

We are excited to begin our new unit on Nocturnal Animals. Throughout this unit, the children will be engaging in a variety of multi-step projects designed to strengthen their ability to follow directions while practicing important fine motor skills such as tracing, cutting, coloring, painting, and gluing.



- Name Game Hedgehog: The children will create a hedgehog and display the letters in the name on fall leaves.
- · Forest at Night: A creative art project where students will build their own nighttime forest scene.
- Bat flying over the moon. Children will color and cut out a bright colorful bat and moon and glue together.
- The ripped paper owl. We will be working those hand muscles to create a beautiful Owl.
- Bullfrog Painting: Children will paint a bright green bullfrog at the easel and complete the project by cutting out their frogs.

To finish the unit, each child will choose two or three animals from four options—Opossum, Raccoon, Skunk or Fox—to create. Each project will reinforce different fine motor skills and emphasize the importance of carefully following directions.

After our nocturnal animal exploration, we'll turn our focus to Thankfulness. The children will:
