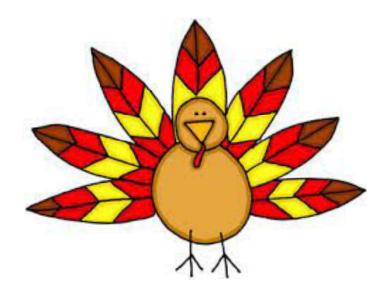
As a reminder, candy is not allowed for snacks or with lunches.

Turkey Feather Information

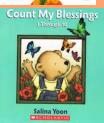

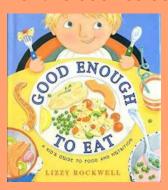

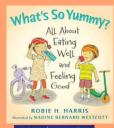
















Parent Corner
